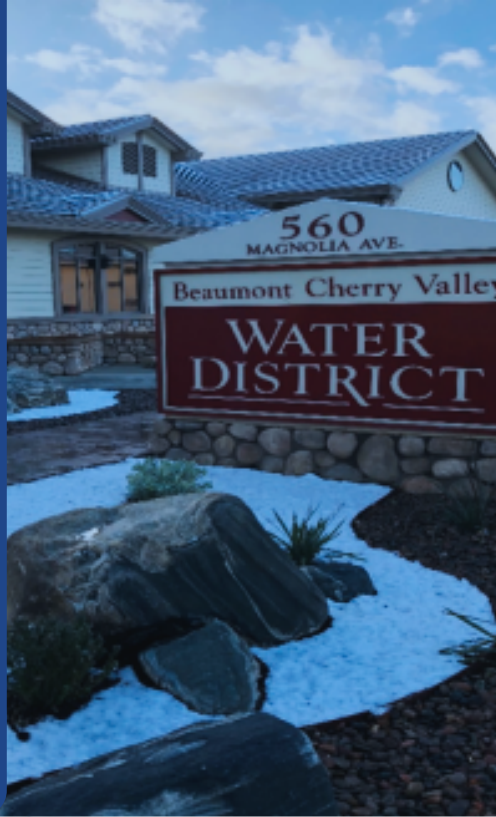


Mission
